
Sibcy House

Sibcy House at Lindner Center of HOPE, is a specialized unit at the Center, offering a comprehensive diagnostic assessment and short-term residential treatment program for patients, age 18 and older, suffering with complex, co-morbid mental health issues.



Sibcy House, a private pay unit, offers:

- A comprehensive diagnostic assessment
- A 28-day Diagnostic and Treatment Program
- Addictive and Co-occurring Disorders Program
- A team of specialists (OCD, eating disorders, mood disorders and addictions)
- Personalized care
- Leading-edge diagnostic and treatment, such as in-house MRI, ECT and TMS
- Current innovations in the field from the on-site Research Institute
- On-site inpatient units for the decompensating patient
- A network of HOPE for further treatment referrals for patients and families
- Positive outcomes



Eating Disorders Treatment

Patients at the Harold C. Schott Foundation Eating Disorders Program at Lindner Center of HOPE are experiencing results. Of the patients who entered Lindner Center of HOPE for eating disorder treatment, 69% did not need to be readmitted for additional treatment.

Lindner Center of HOPE offers a disciplined approach to eating disorder treatment that combines psychiatric management, psychotherapy, nutritional services, and family engagement, including Family Based Therapy, throughout the entire process. Lindner Center of HOPE effectively treats a range of eating disorders, including anorexia nervosa; bulimia nervosa; binge eating disorder; overeating and obesity; and compulsive exercising.

The Harold C. Schott Eating Disorders Treatment team follows the patient through levels of care, including commercial insurance covered:

Inpatient treatment/intensive care for female and male adults and adolescents age 12 and older (adolescent care is provided through a unique collaboration with Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center)



Outpatient services which aid local and regional patients in managing eating disorders

Partial hospitalization for local and regional teens and tweens (ages 12 to 17) who need an intensive treatment option, while returning to their families in the evenings and on weekends.

Short-term residential treatment at Sibcy House, available for private pay, provides premium, unprecedented care for patients ready to take progressive, proven steps to manage symptoms and behaviors associated with eating disorders or when eating disorders is part of a complex diagnosis.

Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation


Providing innovative and advanced diagnostic and treatment options to patients is part of the mission of Lindner Center of HOPE. Not every patient suffering with mental illness benefits from traditional treatment models, therefore innovation is necessary in order to provide hope for recovery.

Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS), a private pay therapy, shows significant recovery for people (age 18 and older) with treatment-resistant depression.

- Each TMS therapy session is a 40-minute outpatient procedure that is prescribed by a psychiatrist, does not require anesthesia or sedation, and patients remain awake and alert

- The treatment is typically administered daily for 4 to 6 weeks and the patient is able to maintain their normal routine
- TMS therapy stimulates nerve cells in an area of the brain believed to be linked to depression
