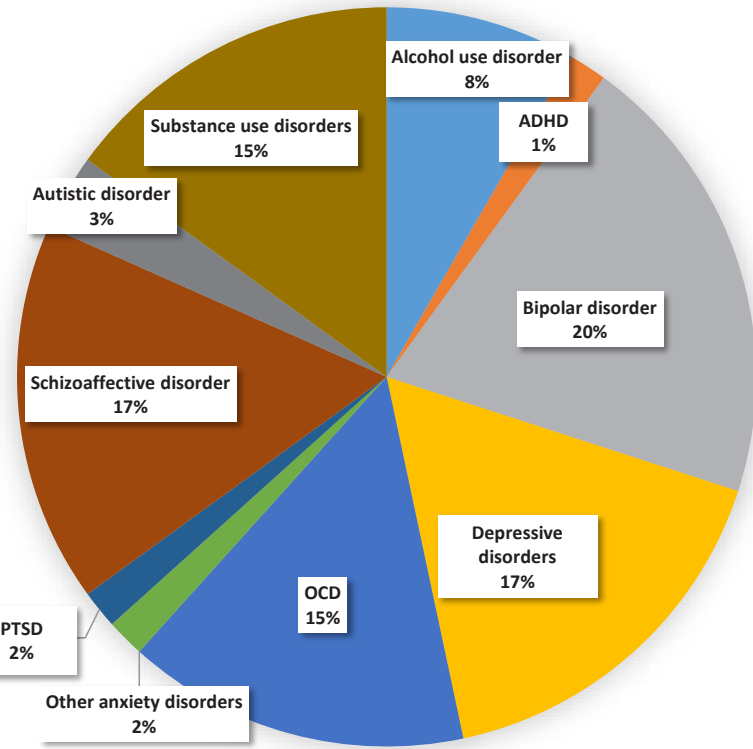


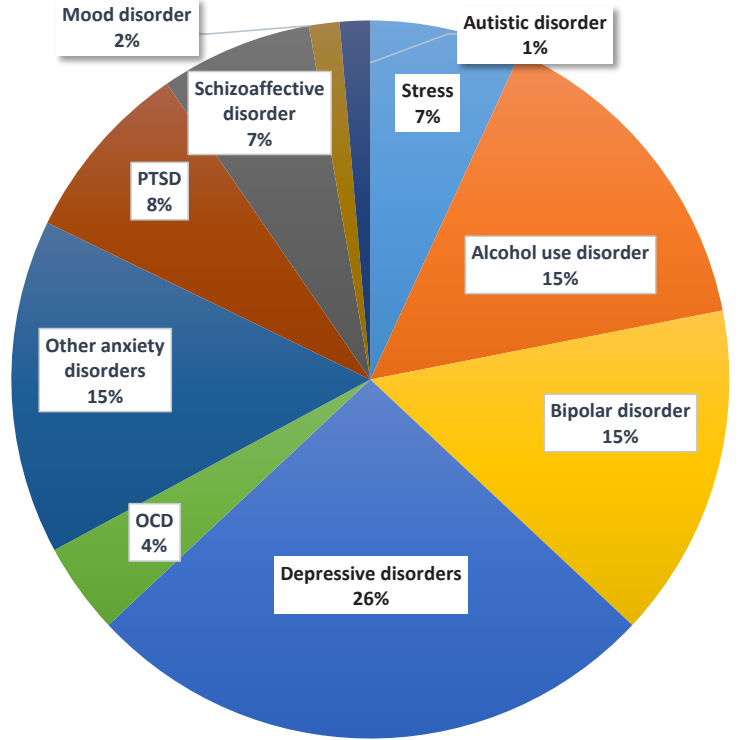

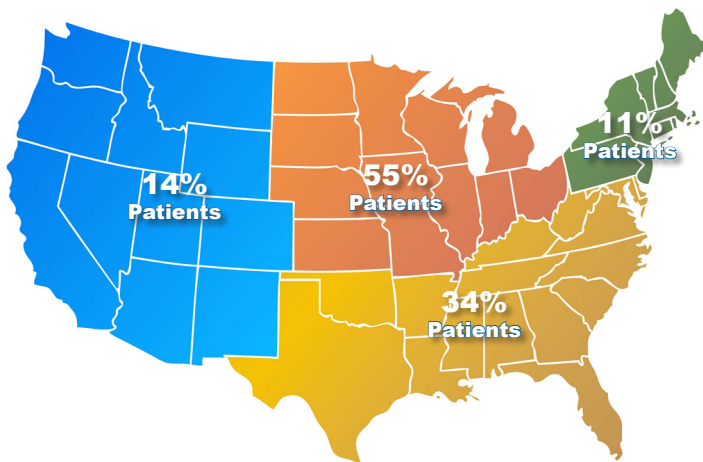
PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS WILLIAMS HOUSE



PRIMARY DIAGNOSIS SIBCY HOUSE

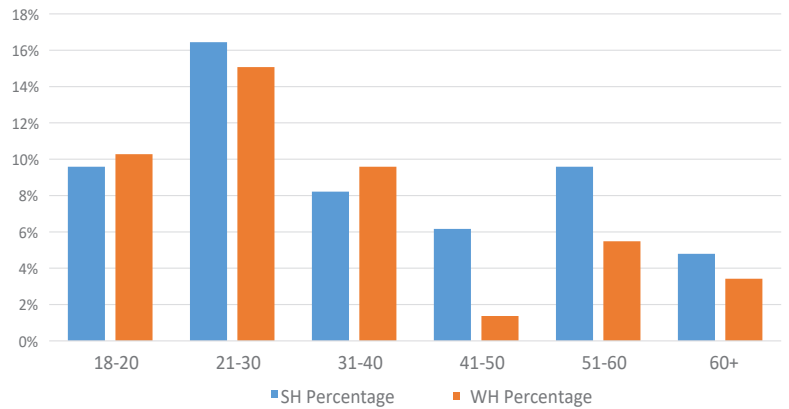


PATIENT BY GEOGRAPHIC AREA

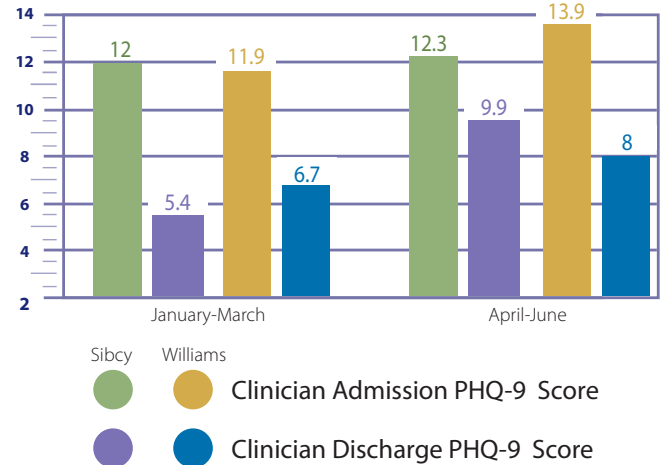
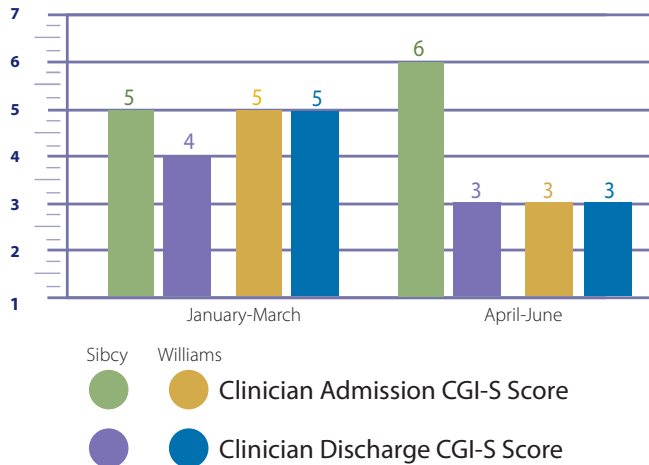

Clinician Scale
 1 = Normal, not at all ill
 2 = Borderline mentally ill
 3 = Mildly ill
 4 = Moderately ill
 5 = Markedly ill
 6 = Severely mentally ill
 7 = Among the most extremely ill patients

Usage of the CGI Scale: The CGI Scale is used at admission and discharge. The Mean of the CGI scores at admission and discharge are assessed as well as the mean of the change between scores from admission to discharge.

Interpretation of Results: An improvement of 1 point or greater is considered clinically significant and meaningful improvement. These results align with positive patient satisfaction scores. The graphs represent all patients who received both a CGI score at admission and at discharge. The numbers above the bars represent the average score for those patients.

Patient Health Questionnaire (PHQ-9) Scale
 0-4 Minimal or none
 5-9 Mild
 10-14 Moderate
 15-19 Moderately severe
 20-27 Severe

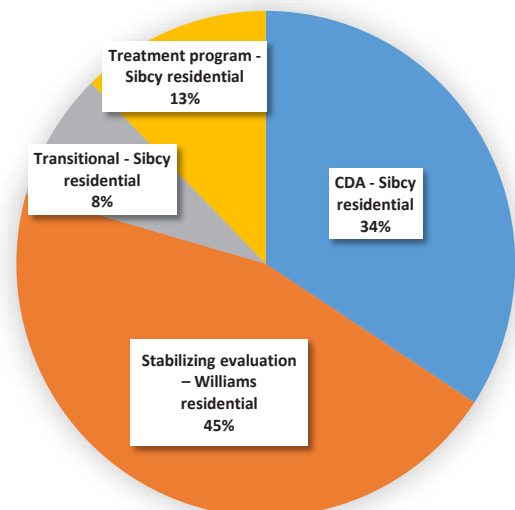
Usage of the PHQ-9: The PHQ-9 is used as a severity measure at admission and discharge. The mean of the change between scores from admission to discharge is assessed.
Interpretation of Results: An improvement of 1 point or greater is considered clinically significant and meaningful improvement. The graphs represent all patients who received PHQ scores both at admission and discharge. The numbers above the bars represent the average score for those patients.
